Please note: While it is not the Board's intention to stifle comment on matters of legitimate concern to the school community, the public should be aware that if their statements violate the rights of others under the law governing defamation or invasion of privacy, they may face personal liability to the injured party.

If speakers are uncertain of the legal ramifications of their comments, the Board urges them to seek guidance beforehand from their own legal advisor

5410 PROMOTION AND RETENTION

A. Elementary

- 1. Kindergarten through Grade 8 students receive a progress report (if in danger of failing) and report card three times a year per Regulation No. 5420. Parent conferences are also an important part of the elementary evaluation process. (Kindergarten students will be retained based upon mutual agreement between parent / guardian and school administration)
- 2. The major subjects in grades Kindergarten, One, Two and Three are **Literacy Development** and **Mathematics**.
- 3. A student in Grades K, One, Two and Three, who is not meeting grade level requirements on the final report card in Literacy Development and / or Mathematics will be retained.
 - Grade K, one, and two will be retained if a student scores Needs Support on more than 40% of the grade level standards in Literacy Development and Mathematics.
 - o Kindergarten: Needs Support in more than 18 of the 45 standards in both Literacy Development and Mathematics; upon mutual agreement between parent/guardian and school administration
 - o Grade One: Needs Support in more than 18 of the 44 standards in both Literacy Development and Mathematics
 - Grade Two: Needs Support in more than 21 of the 53 standards in both Literacy Development and Mathematics
 - Grade Three will be retained if a student scores < 70. A grade of 69 and below in Literacy Development AND / OR Mathematics.
- 4. Major subjects in grades 4-8 are English Language Arts (ELA), Mathematics, science, and social studies. A student failing Mathematics will be retained in grade. Moreover, a student failing two or more major subjects will also be retained in grade. (For example, science and social studies, science and ELA, social studies and ELA, Mathematics and any additional major subject)

PROMOTION and RETENTION

- 5. In addition, students who are identified as failing Mathematics in grades 4, 5, 6, 7, or 8 after any progress report or report card are recommended to attend a Mathematics support class with a teacher of Mathematics at his or her neighborhood school on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday mornings. Students may exit the zero period support class if they earn a 78 or better on the next trimester marking period report card. Students who fail to maintain regular attendance (65% of eligible classes) in the morning sessions will not be eligible for elementary Mathematics summer school and will be retained in grade if the students fail Mathematics for the school year.
- 6. A waiver may be granted in certain circumstances for appeals to the morning attendance policy. The appeal will be reviewed by the school level committee who will ultimately render a judgment.
- 7. Attendance is also a factor in grades 1-12 in determining promotion per Regulation No. 5200.

B. High School

In order to be placed in the following year's registration room, a student must acquire the following credits.

Senior Registration Room = Eligible to graduate in June of the following year

Junior Registration Room = 60 credits

Sophomore Registration Room = 30 credits

Failure to acquire these credits will cause a student to be placed in the same year registration room.

C. General Rules

1. In all schools and grades the decision concerning promotion shall be submitted by the teacher(s) to the principal for approval. Decisions by the principal concerning promotion shall be final, but parents may exercise their right of appeal to the Superintendent.

2. At the end of each trimester marking period the number of subject failures in each class shall be reported by the principal to the Superintendent. At the end of the school year the elementary principals shall report to the Superintendent the number of promotions and non-promotions in each class. In high school the principal shall report subject failures for each marking period and final subject failures in accord with departmental organization.

WHEREAS, this Board of Education intends to enroll in the Waksman Student Scholars Program for the 2025-2026 school year; a program that provides opportunities for high school students and their teachers to conduct an authentic research project in molecular biology and bioinformatics and publish their findings;

WHEREAS, students registered for a science research course at Bayonne High School will collaborate on activities provided by the Waksman Institute. The district will pick up supplies and equipment at the Waksman Institute (Rutgers University) several times during the school year and obtain basic supplies such as pipet tips, microfuge tubes, culture tubes, sterile pipette and agarose to run the program. Additionally, students and staff will participate in several field trips.

BE IT RESOLVED, that this Board of Education hereby approves the Bayonne School District to participate in the Waksman Student Scholars Program for the 2025-2026 school year.

WHEREAS, The Board of Education of the City of Bayonne in the County of Hudson, New Jersey (the "Board of Education" or the "School District"), decided to investigate implementation of an energy savings improvement program and arranged for the conduct of energy audits of the school district facilities, and the audits were conducted and delivered to this Board of Education; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education determined to utilize competitive contracting pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-4.1 *et seq.* for the selection of an energy savings company ("ESCO") to assist the School District with the development and implementation of an energy savings plan; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education appointed DCO Energy, LLC ("DCO") to serve as its ESCO in accordance with the competitive contracting process, and DCO has worked with the Board of Education to develop an energy savings plan; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education hired DLB Associates to verify the energy savings to be realized through the energy savings plan, and DLB Associates issued a report verifying the savings; and

WHEREAS, the Energy Savings Plan and verification report were submitted to the Board of Public Utilities Office of Clean Energy (the "BPU") for their review, and the BPU reviewed and approved the plan; and

WHEREAS, by resolution, the Board of Education approved the energy savings plan, and the energy savings plan was posted on the Board of Education's website and submitted to the BPU for posting on its website; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education has determined that the energy savings generated from reduced energy use from the program will be sufficient to cover the cost of the program's energy conservation measures set forth in the energy savings plan and, therefore, has determined to implement the plan pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-4.6 and to finance the program through the issuance of energy savings obligations authorized as refunding bonds pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-4.6(c)(3) and 18A:24-61.1 et seq.; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE CITY OF BAYONNE IN THE COUNTY OF HUDSON, NEW JERSEY (with not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The School District is hereby authorized to provide for energy conservation measures described in its approved energy savings plan and related work.

Section 2. In order to finance the cost of the improvements described in Section 1 hereof, negotiable school energy savings obligation refunding bonds (the "Bonds") are hereby authorized to be issued, in one or more series, in the aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$18,300,000 pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-4.6 (c)(3) and N.J.S.A. 18A:24-61.1 *et seq*.

Section 3. An aggregate amount not exceeding \$275,000 for items of expense for issuing the bonds permitted under N.J.S.A. 18A:24-61.4 has been included in the aggregate principal amount of Bonds authorized herein.

Section 4. A supplemental debt statement has been prepared and filed in the offices of the Clerk of the City of Bayonne (the "City") and the Business Administrator/Board Secretary and in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey as required by law. Such statement shows that the gross debt of the City as defined in the Local Bond Law and the school debt of the School District is increased by the amount of the Bond authorization set forth herein.

Section 5. A certified copy of this school energy savings obligation refunding bond ordinance as adopted on first reading has been filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey prior to final adoption, together with a complete statement in the form prescribed by the Director and signed by the Business Administrator/Board Secretary or the Board President of the School District as to the indebtedness to be financed by the issuance of the obligations authorized herein.

Section 1. The Board of Education of the City of Bayonne in the County of Hudson, New Jersey (the "Board of Education"), hereby authorizes the sale, in one or more series, of an amount not to exceed \$18,300,000 School Energy Savings Obligation Refunding Bonds (the "Bonds") by virtue of its final adoption by a two-thirds majority of its full membership on March 18, 2025 of a bond ordinance entitled, "School Energy Savings Obligation Refunding Bond Ordinance of The Board of Education of the City of Bayonne in the County of Hudson, New Jersey, Providing for Energy Conservation Improvements, Appropriating not to Exceed \$18,300,000 Therefor and Authorizing the Issuance of not to Exceed \$18,300,000 Energy Savings Obligation Refunding Bonds to Provide for Such Improvements."

Section 2. The Bonds are hereby authorized to be sold to Raymond James, an investment banking institution (the "Underwriter") recommended to the Business Administrator/Board Secretary, by Phoenix Advisors, the municipal adviser (the "Municipal Advisor"), based on their solicitation of proposals for such financial services. The Bonds will be old to the Underwriter in accordance with a purchase contract to be entered into by and between

the Underwriter and the Board of Education (the "Purchase Contract") pursuant to and in accordance with this resolution and their proposal. The purchase price for the Bonds shall be as set forth in the Purchase Contract, plus unpaid accrued interest, if any, from the dated date of the Bonds to, but not including, the delivery date of the Bonds. The Board President, Superintendent and/or Business Administrator/Board Secretary is hereby authorized to enter into the Purchase Contract on behalf of the Board of Education with the Underwriter in a form satisfactory to McManimon, Scotland & Baumann, LLC, bond counsel for the Board of Education ("Bond Counsel") for the sale of the Bonds to the Underwriter in accordance with the provisions of this resolution and otherwise in accordance with and subject to approval of the refunding bond ordinance by the Local Finance Board. The signature of the Board President, Superintendent or Business Administrator/Board Secretary on the Purchase Contract shall be conclusively presumed to evidence any necessary approvals.

Section 3. The Bonds are being issued to provide for the energy savings improvements described in the school district's Energy Savings Plan approved by the Board of Education on February 25, 2025.

- Section 4. The Bonds shall be issued in accordance with the terms and the conditions set forth in the Purchase Contract within the parameters set forth herein:
- (A) The Bonds shall be issued in a par amount determined to be necessary to pay costs of issuance and to provide for the energy savings improvements, all in accordance with the Local Finance Board approval;
 - (B) The Bonds shall be dated such date as established in the Purchase Contract;

- (C) The Bonds shall mature in the principal amounts on or about July 15 of each year, commencing on or about July 15, 2027 and thereafter or as otherwise set forth in the Purchase Contract and shall bear interest at interest rates per annum on the unpaid principal balance on each January 15 and July 15 until maturity or earlier redemption, commencing on or about January 15, 2026, or as otherwise set forth in the Purchase Contract;
 - (D) The Bonds shall be issued in the form of one bond for each maturity;
- (E) The Bonds shall be numbered consecutively from R-1 upward and shall mature in such principal amounts with a final principal maturity no later than July 15, 2046 or such other time as set forth in the Purchase Contract and with such mandatory call features and mandatory sinking fund payments as determined in the Purchase Contract;

In the event that The Depository Trust Company may determine to discontinue providing its service with respect to the Bonds or is removed by the Board of Education and if no successor securities depository is appointed, the Bonds which were previously issued in book-entry form shall be converted to registered bonds (the "Registered Bonds") in denominations of \$5,000, or any integral multiple thereof, except that an amount maturing in any one year in excess of the largest principal amount thereof equaling a multiple of \$5,000 will be in denominations of \$1,000, or any integral multiple thereof. The beneficial owner under the bookentry system, upon registration of the Bonds held in the beneficial owner's name, will become the registered owner of such Registered Bonds. The Board of Education shall be obligated to provide for the execution and delivery of the Registered Bonds in certificate form.

Section 10. The Board of Education hereby covenants that it will comply with any conditions subsequent imposed by the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), in order to preserve the exemption from taxation of interest on the Bonds, including the requirement to rebate all net investment earnings on the gross proceeds above the yield on the Bonds, and that it will refrain from taking any action that would adversely affect the tax exemption of the Bonds under the Code. The Board of Education authorizes the Business Administrator/Board Secretary to act and determine on behalf of the Board of Education whether the Bonds will be designated as "bank qualified" within the meaning of Section 265 of the Code.

The Board of Education hereby declares the intent of the Board of Education to issue obligations in the amount authorized herein and to use the proceeds to pay or reimburse expenditures for the costs of the purposes described herein. This Section 10 contains a declaration of intent within the meaning and for purposes of Treasury Regulations §1.150-2 or any successor provisions of federal income tax law.

Section 11. Solely for purposes of complying with Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission, as amended and interpreted from time to time (the "Rule"), and provided that the Bonds are not exempt from the Rule and provided that the Bonds are not exempt from the following requirements in accordance with paragraph (d) of the Rule, for so long as the Bonds remain outstanding (unless the Bonds have been wholly defeased), the Board of Education shall provide for the benefit of the holders of the Bonds and the beneficial owners thereof:

(a) On or prior to February 1 of each year, beginning February 1, 2026, electronically to the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board's Electronic Municipal Market Access ("EMMA") system or such other repository designated by the SEC to be an authorized repository for filing secondary market disclosure information, if any, annual financial information with respect to the Board of Education consisting of the audited financial statements (or unaudited financial statements if audited financial statements are not then available, which audited financial statements will be delivered when and if available) of the Board of Education and certain financial information and operating data consisting of (1) Board of Education and overlapping indebtedness including a schedule of outstanding debt issued by the Board of Education; (2) property valuation information; and (3) tax rate, levy and collection data. The audited financial statements will be prepared in

accordance with generally accepted accounting principles as modified by governmental accounting standards as may be required by New Jersey law.

- (b) If any of the following material events occur regarding the Bonds, a timely notice not in excess of ten business days after the occurrence of the event sent to EMMA:
 - (1) Principal and interest payment delinquencies;
 - (2) Non-payment related defaults, if material;
 - (3) Unscheduled draws on debt service reserves reflecting financial difficulties;
 - (4) Unscheduled draws on credit enhancements reflecting financial difficulties;
 - (5) Substitution of credit or liquidity providers, or their failure to perform;
 - (6) Adverse tax opinions, the issuance by the Internal Revenue Service of proposed or final determinations of taxability, Notices of Proposed Issue (IRS Form 5701-TEB) or other material notices or determinations with respect to the tax status of the Bonds, or other material events affecting the tax status of the Bonds;
 - (7) Modifications to rights of holders of the Bonds, if material;
 - (8) Bond calls, if material, and tender offers;
 - (9) Defeasances;
 - (10) Release, substitution, or sale of property securing repayment of the Bonds, if material;
 - (11) Rating changes;
 - (12) Bankruptcy, insolvency, receivership or similar event of the obligated person;
 - (13) The consummation of a merger, consolidation or acquisition involving an obligated person or the sale of all or substantially all of the assets of the obligated person, other than in the ordinary course of business, the entry into a definitive agreement to undertake such an action or the termination of a definitive agreement relating to any such actions, other than pursuant to its terms, if material;
 - (14) Appointment of a successor or additional trustee or the change of name of a trustee, if material;
 - (15) Incurrence of a Financial Obligation of the Board, if material, or agreement to covenants, events of default, remedies, priority rights or other similar terms of a Financial Obligation, any of which affect holders of the Bonds, if material;
 - (16) Default, event of acceleration, termination event, modification of terms or other similar events under a Financial Obligation of the Board, if any such event reflects financial difficulties.

For the purposes of the event identified in subparagraph (b) 12) above, the event is considered to occur when any of the following occur: the appointment of a receiver, fiscal agent or similar officer for an obligated person in a proceeding under the U.S. Bankruptcy Code or in any other proceeding under state or federal law in which a court or governmental authority has assumed jurisdiction over substantially all of the assets or business of the obligated person, or if such jurisdiction has been assumed by leaving the existing governing body and officials or officers in possession but subject to the supervision and orders of a court or governmental authority, or the entry of an order confirming a plan of reorganization, arrangement or liquidation by a court or governmental authority having supervision or jurisdiction over substantially all of the assets or business of the obligated person.

The term "Financial Obligation" as used in subparagraphs (b)(15) and (b)(16) above means a (i) debt obligation, (ii) derivative instrument entered into in connection with, or pledged as security or a source of payment for, an existing or planned debt obligation or (iii) guarantee of (i) or (ii); provided, however, that the term "Financial Obligation" shall not include municipal securities as to which a final official statement has been provided to the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board consistent with the Rule.

Notice of failure of the Board of Education to provide required annual financial information on or before the date specified in this resolution shall be sent in a timely manner to EMMA.

If all or any part of the Rule ceases to be in effect or changes for any reason, then the information required to be provided under this resolution, insofar as the provisions of the Rule no longer in effect or changed required the provision of such information, shall no longer be required to be provided or shall be provided as changed.

The Business Administrator/Board Secretary shall determine, in consultation with Bond Counsel, the application of the Rule or the exemption from the Rule for each issue of obligations of the Board of Education prior to their offering. Such officer is hereby authorized to enter into additional written contracts or undertakings to implement the Rule and is further authorized to amend such contracts or undertakings or the undertakings set forth in this resolution, provided such amendment is, in the opinion of nationally recognized bond counsel, in compliance with the Rule.

In the event that the Board of Education fails to comply with the Rule requirements or the written contracts or undertakings specified in this resolution, the Board of Education shall not be liable for monetary damages, remedy being hereby specifically limited to specific performance of the Rule requirements or the written contracts or undertakings therefor.

Section 12. If the Municipal Advisor believes that a public offering rather than a private placement is the more cost effective way to finance, the Board of Education hereby approves the preparation and the distribution of the Preliminary Official Statement in the form to be approved by the Business Administrator/Board Secretary. Such Official Statement may be distributed in preliminary form and deemed final for purposes of Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission on behalf of the Board of Education by the Business Administrator/Board Secretary. The Preliminary Official Statement shall be prepared in final form in connection with the issuance of the Bonds, and the Business Administrator/Board Secretary is authorized to execute any certificates necessary in connection with the distribution of the Official Statement. Final Official Statements shall be delivered to the Underwriter within the earliest of seven business days following the sale of the Bonds or to accompany the Underwriter's confirmations that request payment for the Bonds.

Section 13. The Business Administrator/Board Secretary, with the advice of the Board of Education's Municipal Advisor and Bond Counsel, is authorized to arrange for bond insurance if advantageous based on the advice of the Municipal Advisor to be provided at a premium not to exceed an amount of principal and interest payable in order to obtain the best possible rates, reduce the cost of borrowing and result in the most cost effective financing and is authorized to take all steps on behalf of the Board of Education necessary to do so.

Section 14. The Business Administrator/Board Secretary, with the advice of the Board of Education's Bond Counsel, shall arrange for paying agent services or redemption agent services with a banking institution if any portion of the Bonds are term bonds requiring a sinking fund.

Section 15. The Business Administrator/Board Secretary is also authorized to pay the costs of issuance and initial ESCO implementation contract payment at or after the time of closing to the various participants regarding the sale and issuance of the bonds based upon the recommendation of the Board of Education's Municipal Advisor and Bond Counsel to pay such costs. The Business Administrator/Board Secretary is further authorized to enter into an agreement on behalf of the Board of Education with a banking institution to escrow the bond proceeds and to arrange for the deposit and investment of the bond proceeds.

Section 16. The Business Administrator/Board Secretary shall take all steps necessary to invest the proceeds of the refunding bonds until application to project costs with the advice of the Municipal Advisor.

Section 17. The Board of Education hereby reaffirms and ratifies its determination that the energy savings generated from reduced energy use from the Energy Conservation Measures set for in its Energy Savings Plan will be sufficient to cover the cost of the program's Energy Conservation Measures and that it is in the best interest of the Board of Education to implement the Energy Savings Plan pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-4.6, reaffirms and ratifies its approval of the Energy Savings Plan in the form submitted to and approved by the Board of Public Utilities.

Section 18. The Board President, Superintendent, Business Administrator/Board Secretary and other appropriate representatives of the Board of Education are hereby authorized to take all steps necessary to provide for the issuance of the Bonds, including preparing and

executing such agreements and documents on behalf of the Board of Education and taking all steps necessary or desirable to implement the requirements of this resolution, such agreements and documents as may be necessary and appropriate and the transactions contemplated thereby.

Section 19. The reference to officers or representatives of the Board of Education in this resolution shall be deemed to include any interim, assistant, vice, deputy, acting or successor officer or representative authorized to act in that capacity and the Vice President of the Board of Education in the event of the unavailability or absence of the Board President.

Section 20. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption of this resolution and the refunding bond ordinance by this Board of Education and approval of the refunding bond ordinance by the Local Finance Board.
